\$15,750,000 Successor of Leviathan as Biggest U. S. Liner



The biggest liner in the world, nor the fastest, the handsome ship that will be the pride of the American Merchant Marine, successor to the rusting Leviathan, is sketched above. The vessel will be built at Newport News, Va., at a cost of \$15,750,000, part of which will be a government subsidy, for operation by the United States Lines. It will be 723 feet long, displace 34,000 tons and have accommodations for 1200 passengers. Its speed of 22 knots is no rival for the Normandie's 35 knots.
