POSTAL RECEIPT GAINS CONTINUE

Postal receipts for the month of September 1937, totaled \$9,921.37, according to the monthly report compiled by R. L. Griffith, assistant postmaster.

This amount showed an increase of 27,995 per cent over the same month in 1936.

Receipts for the September quarter, (July, August and September), were \$29,756.31, a gain of 19,193 per cent for the same quarter in 1936.

These gains are in line with

steadily increases in postal business in the city which have continued over a two-year period, according to postal officials.
