The first event on Premier Mussolini's program after arrival at Munich, Germany, to visit Adolf Hitler was scheduled as an inspection of the honor guard. But it is pretty hard to tell who was the most inspected, Mussolini or the guard. The Italian leader, right, accompanied by Hitler, strides briskly past the troops, who stand at the traditionally immobile "present arms." The passing glimpse wasn't enough for at least one soldier, however. Seen between Mussolini and Hitler, he snatches a peek at Il Duce's back.

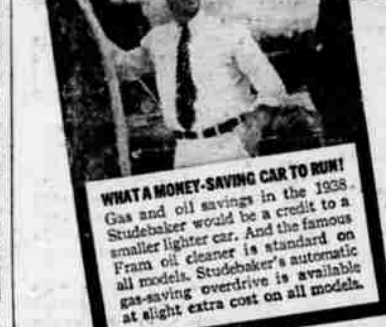
