

Oregon Farm Prices Decline

LEVEL DROPS 10 PER CENT BELOW JUNE

Although the index of the general level of farm prices in Oregon has dropped approximately 10 per cent since June and, at 10 per cent of the 1926-1930 average, is 3 points under September, 1937, the year 1937 is expected to exceed that of 1936.

The gain in agricultural income in 1937 is expected to be approximately 12 per cent over the 1936 average, and to a possible increase of about 3 per cent in the gross volume of agricultural production. Data in the report show that farm prices were at a relatively high level during the first half of 1937, declining during the summer and fall months under new crop influences. In general, the season has been very favorable for crops, both in Oregon and in the country as a whole.

Although the report states that the estimates are quite preliminary in nature, the increase in Oregon agricultural income in 1937 over 1936 is expected to be approximately 15 per cent, or about \$20,000,000. This is due to the value added by agricultural manufacturing operations and farm sales of numerous specialty farm products, as well as income from the principal crop and animal products, total agricultural income is expected to reach \$150,000,000 or more in 1937, the greatest since 1929.

On the other hand, however, the census shows that the income of 1937 will be divided between a considerably greater number of farm operators in Oregon, consequently the purchasing power per family has not increased to the same extent as total agricultural income.

MOST TURKS SOLD BY INDEPENDENTS

Sixty-five per cent of the Oregon turkey crop is sold through independent dealers and 35 per cent through the four district cooperative associations. Seventy per cent of Oregon-grown turkeys are shipped to out-of-state markets.

This is part of a large fund of information pertaining to Oregon's 2 1/2 to three million dollar turkey industry found in a leaflet entitled, "Let's Talk Turkey," prepared by J. R. Beck, extension specialist in rural service, using data supplied by Noel Bennion, extension poultryman. It is the latest of a series of leaflets on different phases of Oregon's agriculture which Mr. Beck has prepared as program material for use of all rural organizations and other interested groups.

As to the turkey situation this year, the leaflet shows that 7,989,000 pounds of turkeys were in cold storage in the United States on September 1 last year, while on the same date this year the pounds of turkeys in storage was 12,314,000. It is estimated that Oregon will market 700,000 pounds of turkeys this year, as compared with 800,000 pounds last year.

The pamphlet also shows that it takes an average of 75 pounds of feed to produce a turkey ready for market at 26 weeks of age, and that it requires from four to five pounds of feed to produce a pound of gain, from hatching to maturity. Early gains are the cheapest, it is pointed out.

Other feeding pointers indicate that feed costs can be reduced 10 to 20 per cent by using alfalfa, sunflowers, corn fields, etc., as pasture; that each bird needs six inches of hopper space, and that it is best not to give strong feeds, such as low-grade fish meal or inferior vitamin D fish-bearing oils, within the last six weeks before killing.

That breeding hens confined require eight feet of floor space, and that one ton is required for each 12 to 14 hens, are other facts brought out in the leaflet.
