

Shores of Opportunity All Ready for Discovery, Says Rail Chief in Speech Here

"There is a new frontier for every generation," said Edward F. Flynn, of St. Paul, assistant to the general counsel, Great Northern Railway company and past director of Rotary International, in addressing Kiwanis club at the Willard hotel Thursday noon.

Flynn said in part: "Historians tell us frontiers vanished about 1890, yet we all know our greatest eras of prosperity have occurred since that time. To those young men and women and all others who feel that romance and adventure have passed with the Indian and the free homestead let me say there is today more romance and adventure in chemistry, biochemistry, biology, physics, engineering, the sciences, medicine and governmental administration than ever before existed."

"The United States is today by far the greatest chemical nation in the world and produces more than one half of all the world's chemicals."

"Scientists have produced synthetic rubber under different trade names, such as Neoprene, Thiokol, Koroseal and Plioform. These synthetic rubbers are generally too expensive to replace natural rubber but are used extensively where oil, gasoline or other liquids might destroy natural rubber. One of these days a new chemical will be discovered no doubt which will enable us to manufacture synthetic rubber that can be placed on the market as cheap as natural rubber but it will be many times as lasting."

"Recently, near Clinton, Ia., the E. I. DuPont de Nemours and Company, Inc., purchased some 250 acres of land and is just completing construction of a factory which will cover approximately 24 acres of floor space for the purpose of manufacturing cellophane only. The cellophane company, which calls itself the "granddaddy of them all" also makes "Protectoid" which is used for the same purposes, generally, as cellophane. Cellophane and similar materials are largely made of cellulose, which is found in large quantities in the cotton boll, the majestic spruce, aspen tree, and many other growing plants. Ordinary straw contains about 40 per cent cellulose."

"A few years ago it seemed as though the nation's supply of bromine was practically exhausted. Scientists quietly commenced research work in the ocean's waters off the coast of New England and discovered the sea's water was literally full of bromine. The Ethyl-Dow company now obtains from ocean waters at Kure Beach, near Wilmington, N. C., 1,300,000 pounds of bromine each month. In order to do so it is necessary for them to pass over extractors one billion gallons of ocean water a day."

"If there are not enough opportunities in the scientific world certainly there are opportunities galore in the literary world. O. O. McIntyre, who died recently, had a difficult time making a living 25 years ago but because he found a means of mixing up ordinary words in an interesting readable way, he was receiving more than \$2000 a week for his writing at the time of his death. Along the same lines Arthur Brisbane, who died a year or two ago, was receiving at the time of his demise over \$250,000 a year largely from his column 'Today,' and other editorials."

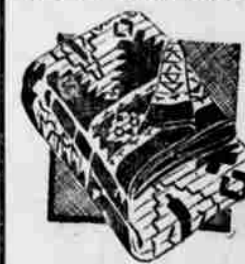
