KLAMATH INVITED TO HEAR ORATORIO

Music lovers and friends of the University of Oregon in Klamath Falls and vicinity have been invited to attend the performance of Handel's oratorio, "The Messiah," which will be given in McArthur court on the campus next Sunday night, March 2, according to word received here today.

Many students, whose home

town is Klamath Falls, are appearing in the production, which will feature the 500-voice University Choral union, the University Symphony orchestra of 70 members, and four soloists well known in northwest music circles. The concert which is considered to be the major campus musical event of 1940-41, will be under the direction of Dean Theodore Kraft of the music school, who also conducted last season's production of Mendelssohn's "Elijah" with the choral union and the orchestra.

Soloists for the event will include Lester Ready, baritone, and Don Eva, tenor, who have appeared on numerous occasions with the Eugene Gleemen. Josephine Albert Spaulding, who was guest artist with the Portland Philharmonic in December,

will sing the contralto role, while the soprano part will be interpreted by Evelyn Gibson, instructor in piano and voice at Linfield college.

"The Messiah," which is the public's favorite among Handel's many works, was produced for the first time in Dublin just 200 years ago. Many consider it to have the "better qualities" of both the opera and the symphony form. It will be given in music and programs will contain the complete words to the oratorio.

The concert will be under the co-sponsorship of the university music school and the educational activities board.
