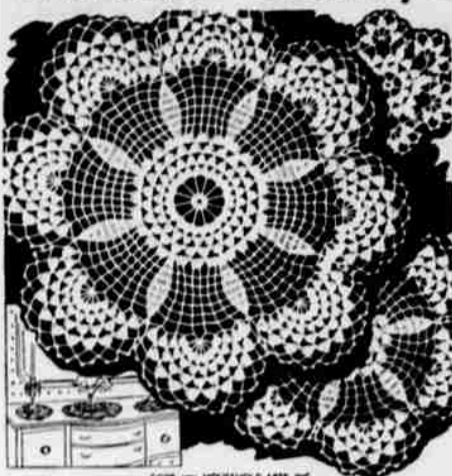
**Leaves Hospital** — Mrs. L. N. Haines, who underwent a major operation at the Hillside hospital, has returned to her home at 901 Lincoln street.

## Meetings Stated For Conservation Program Signing

Klamath county farmers who intend to participate in the 1941 agricultural conservation program and have not yet signed their farm plan and estimate sheets will be given an opportunity to do so this week. The county association office has arranged special meetings for this purpose to be held in the county office, 209 Federal building, Klamath Falls, Wednesday, March 5, to Saturday, March 8, inclusive. The hours will be from 10 a. m. to 5 p. m. each day.

Farm plan and estimate sheets must be signed to cover each farming unit in order to be eligible for 1941 payments. Operators will be required to comply on all farms which they operate in order to collect payment on any.

The farm plan and estimate sheets are also used as official notice of all farm allotments for 1941. Potato growers who have not yet received notice of their potato acreage allotments must file their requests or appeals by March 8. Any appeals filed after that date will not be given consideration by the committee.
