

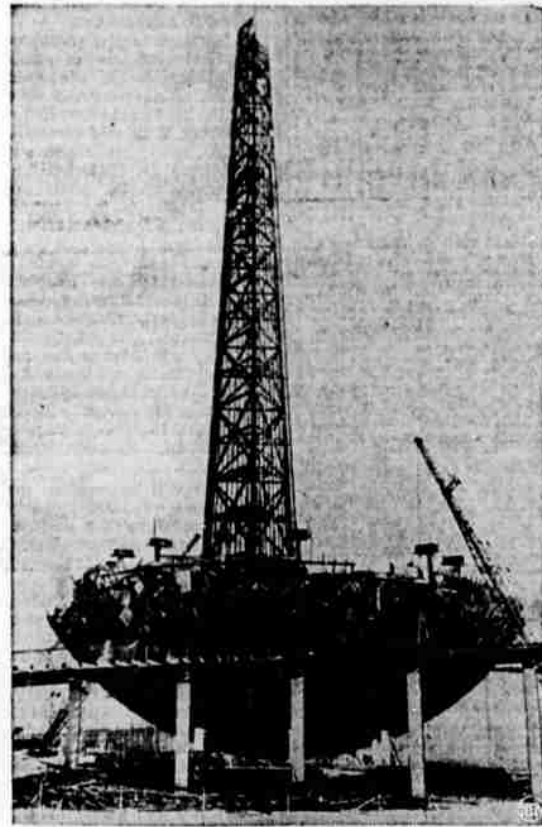

### S. F. Girl to Give Up America for Love of Young Nazi



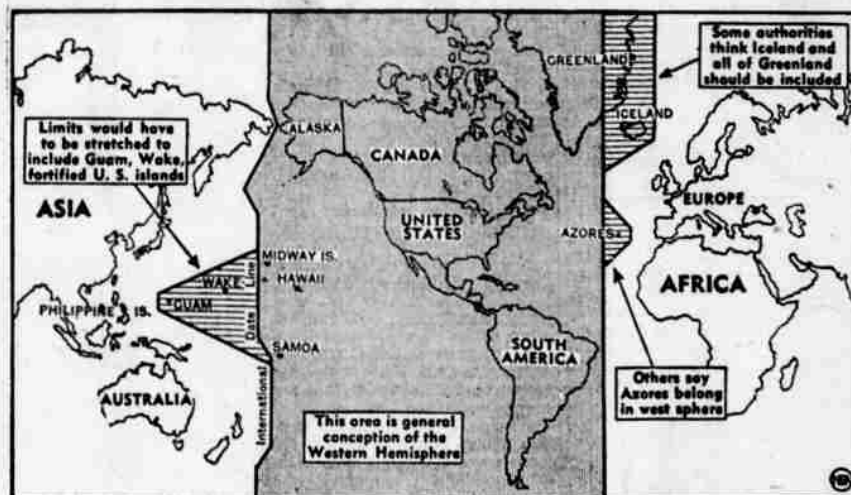

### They Confer in Vienna on Rumania's Part in Axis

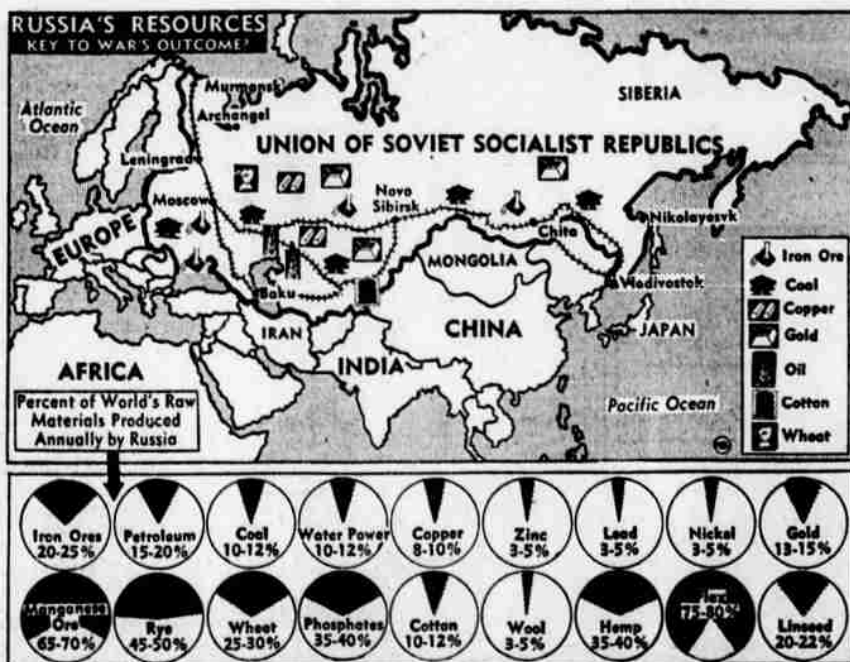

### Just Where DOES This Western Hemisphere Leave Off?

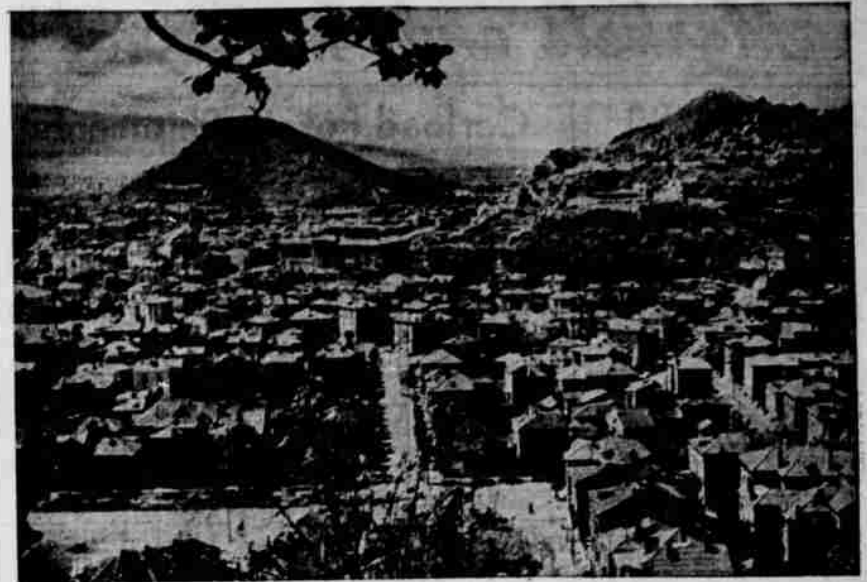


Proposals in Congress to restrict U. S. armed forces to the western hemisphere have made its geographical definition a knotty problem. Large shaded area shows general conception of its bounds, but not until it achieved irregular limits of additions shown would the western hemisphere actually include half of the world's area.



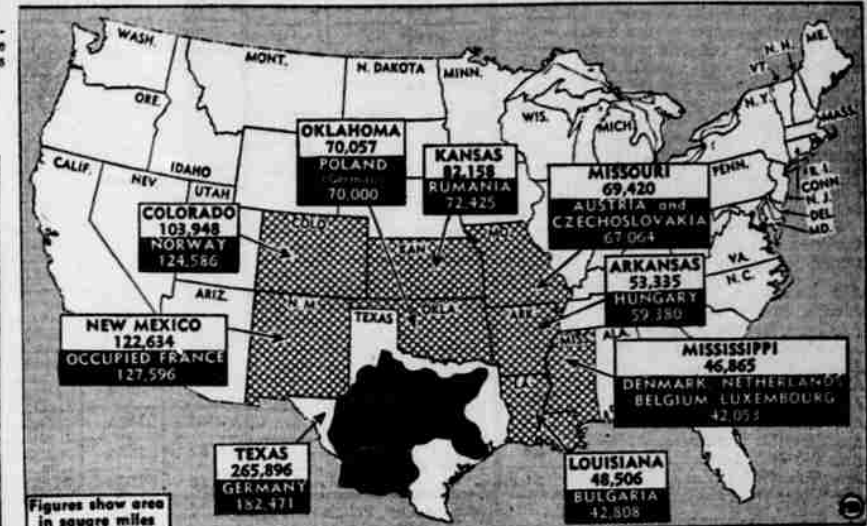
Outcome of Europe's war may hinge on the manner of distribution of the great resources of Soviet Russia, more of which are now going to Germany under terms of a new trade pact. Map locates centers in Russia and Siberia where principal resources are found, and chart shows the Soviet's percentage of world production for various raw materials.

### Where Nazi Forces Mass Near Greek Frontier



This is the Bulgarian town of Plovdiv, where Germans are massing a great force threatening both Greece and Turkey. Photo also shows type of country through which Germans are moving south.

### With Bulgaria, German Conquests Equal Eight States



As Bulgaria enters the Nazi orbit just three years to the month after Austria was seized, the military and political conquests of Germany total up to an area equal to that of eight states surrounding Texas. Map shows how area of pre-Hitler Germany, East Prussia excepted, fits in state of Texas. Populations now under German domination total 165,000,000, one-third more than in all the U. S.

### Salonika to the Straits—New Balkan Battleground?



Here is the stage on which the armies and air forces of Germany, Britain, Greece and possibly Turkey may soon clash in a war along Aegean shores. It covers the narrow strip of Thrace from Salonika, second city in Greece, 200 miles to the strategic straits of Dardanelles and Bosphorus.
