A birthday message to the more than 630,000 members of the Girl Scout organization has just been received by the Klamath Falls local council from Mrs. Harvey S. Mudd of Beverly Hills, Calif., president of the Girl Scouts. The organization celebrates its 29th birthday March 12 to 18.

The message reads: "If our founder could speak to us on this anniversary of scouting, I sense that she would choose the theme of peace and good will between all nations and races. Today war has embroiled every continent except South America. North America has not escaped for our neighbor on the north is loyally supporting its mother country. She has our good will as do all the countries to the south of us.

"Our task is to foster their good will so that there will ever be a guarantee of peace among the peoples of this hemisphere. Scouting can carry a message of friendship to the girls of our sister republics and so play a real part in forging a bond of union that no force can shatter."

Among speakers will be Daniel W. Hone, former Milwaukee mayor; Major Harold F. Osborne, from the Presidio, San Francisco; Earl D. Mallory, American Municipal association executive, and others.

A crew placed under control a second 300-acre blaze among snags and new growth on Bells mountain in Clark county, Wash.

On Cougar creek in the Washington, Wash., district a fire burned about 100 acres of snags, ferns and fir seedlings.

Two Crewmen of Capsized Ship Paddle on Door Raft

HONOLULU, T. H., March 12 (UP)—Two crew members of the foundered motorship Stanley Cochrane Tuesday were reported attempting to reach Molokai island by paddling in choppy seas aboard a door torn from the sinking ship.

The other eight crewmen of the Stanley Cochrane were rescued by the interisland steamer Hawaii after they abandoned the ship and took to a raft in shark infested waters.

A coast guard plane and the cutter reliance were searching for David Hookeana and Harold Smythe. Unless they drowned at sea, they have been aboard the door since Sunday night. They left the stricken Stanley Cochrane on the door in an attempt to paddle ashore and bring aid to their companions.

The Stanley Cochrane, engaged in freighting among the islands of the Hawaiian group, was disabled by high winds near the island of Maui four days ago and was towed towards port by a motor launch.

Apparently repairs were made and the launch went on its way only a few hours before the Stanley Cochrane foundered.

Seven of the survivors arrived at Honolulu. The eighth was under treatment at the hospital at Molokai.

Bad Girl ignored her mistress' calls and backed up the slope

carrying a starving German Shepherd puppy whining in a basket. Another puppy in the basket was dead.

CUTS REVENUES

PORTLAND, March 12 (AP)—A legislative bill recently passed, shortening the commercial fishing season and restricting gear, will cost the state fish commission \$15,000 annually in receipts. The commission estimated yesterday the measure would cut coastal fishing revenues in half. It discussed revision of its budget to conform with the change.
