Failure to kill the bull is the low of bullfighting, a great humiliation punishable up to last week by a fine of 1000 pesos (about \$200), which is what it cost Garza.

His failure, a thing unheard of in ten years, moved the authorities last week to adopt a new rule stiffening the penalty to provide up to 15 days in jail and a fine of 5000 pesos.
