WHEAT, CORN LEAD GENERAL ADVANCE

CHICAGO, March 24 (P)—Wheat and corn today led a general grain price rise that reflected strength in lard and soybeans and in securities. Both wheat and corn rose about a cent at times.

Reports of government purchases of certain commodities, including lard, possibly for overseas shipment, and predictions of senate committee approval of legislation calling for increased loan rates on certain farm products were factors which inspired the buying.

Wheat closed 1/4 cent higher than Saturday, May 8-1c, July 8-1/2c; corn 1/4c up, May 6-1/2c, July 6-3/4c; oats 1/4c higher.

BOSTON, March 24 (P) (US Dept. Agr.)—A few sales of fair weight of domestic wools were closed today on the Boston market. Spot combing three-eighths blood territory wools brought 88 to 90 cents, scoured basis. Orders were taken by Boston dealers for graded French-combing fine territory wools to be delivered from the new clip as soon as available at \$1 to \$1.02, scoured basis, delivered to mills. Graded combing Ohio fleeces of three-eighths and also quarter-blood grades were sold, to be delivered as soon as available, at 44 to 45 cents, in the grease, delivered to mills.

STOCKS GAIN IN SELECTIVE MARKET RISE

NEW YORK, March 24 (P)—Stocks set an uneven course upward in a highly selective market today.

Demand converged mostly on a few favored steels, rails, chemicals and miscellaneous industrial shares, lifting some for gains of a point or more.

Renewed strength in commodities, lately seemed to encourage buying in stocks. Senate approval of the \$7,000,000,000 British aid bill reminded the market of the planned "all out" effort to speed war industry.

Transactions approximated 300,000 shares.

Among prominent gainers were American Telephone, U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Du Pont, Chrysler, Anaconda, Santa Fe, Southern Pacific and United Aircraft.

Some preferred shares moved up a point or more, including Pere Marquette and General Steel Castings.

A block of 52,000 shares of Commonwealth and Southern appeared on the tape at 1, of 1/16. Rails resumed a higher trend in the bond market.
