

Begin Spring Days Right By Serving Interesting Breakfasts

Many a spring fever morning grouch can be banished by an interesting breakfast. You can keep within your budget and produce hearty and interesting breakfast dishes if you use imagination in your marketing.

Fresh pineapple is in season. Use it on fried slices of scrapple as a spring surprise. Slice the inexpensive scrapple, fry it delicately brown and serve it piping hot topped with a mound of chopped fresh pineapple.

Calves' brains are a valuable food, also inexpensive. Combined with fresh eggs, they make a delicate breakfast treat. **Brains With Scrambled Eggs** (Serves 4)

One pair calf or beef brains (1 pound), 2 eggs, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon salt, dash cayenne, few grains nutmeg, 1 tablespoon butter, buttered toast.

Soak brains in cold, salted water 30 minutes and peel off membrane. Put in fresh cold salted water and bring slowly to boil. Skim and simmer 20 minutes. Drain. Beat eggs lightly, add milk, seasonings and brain in pieces size of walnut. Turn into hot buttered skillet and cook

gently, stirring occasionally, until egg is set. Serve on pieces of buttered toast.

A fresh tomato and a few sausage cakes can be combined into a good humor stimulant early in the morning.

Tomatoes Baked With Sausage
Cut firm ripe tomatoes in halves crosswise. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and sugar. Place thin sausage cake on each. Bake in moderate oven (350 deg. F.) 30 minutes.

Eggs With Black Butter and Chives (Serves 2)
Four eggs, 3 tablespoons but-

ter, salt, pepper, chopped chives, 1 tablespoon vinegar.
