RESORT DATES BACK TO 1909

The history of Rocky Point resort on Upper Klamath lake is linked closely to that of Klamath county itself. In May of 1909, C. D. Wilson obtained a special use permit for the Rogue River national forest and constructed the resort which, at that time, was available only by boat. Be-tween the years 1909 to 1914, inclusive, Wilson operated Rocky Point, and continued in owner-ship until 1925 when it was purchased by the California Oregon

Under a sub-lease, Wilson turned the property over to Charles Pickett who operated the resort from 1915 to 1916, and with the cancellation of this lease, the place was leased to Charles Hart and Maude Wheeler who were operators from 1917 to 1922. Another lease was given to A. C. Allen and Maude Wheel-

to 1924.
In March of 1925, Copco took
the holdings and Art Leavover the holdings and Art Leav-itt, now located in Medford, operated the resort until July, 1940. The company made extensive im-provements in excess of \$10,000. When Leavitt took over the resort the only original buildings sort the only original buildings on the site included the boat house, store, and log cabin and bungalow. All sleeping quar-ters were tents on frames, and when Copco became interested company constructed sleep-recepting cabins, dining room, dock, water and sewer systems. The California Oregon Power

company gave up the use permit in the summer of 1940, and in early spring of 1941, the Rogue River national forest issued a special use permit to Moise Penning of this city who has now

started operations.

The resort was operated for a number of years before the road was constructed around the lake Many pleasure parties left each week-end by boat for Rocky Point where hunting and fishing






