We, too, must publish abroad the news of the risen Lord. Our testimony, like that of Mary, must be personal. It is an ex-perience to which she herself could give a definite witness. We copy her when we sing 'He rose again and He lives in my heart.' It must be positive. 'I have seen,' cried Mary. Her witness might be doubted, but could not be contradicted. It must be persuasive. Mary would go on her errand with a radiant face. Her manner would add persuasive-ness to her message. Does not this suggest how we ought to our Saviour, too.
