King Missing

German quarters said they had no information tonight as to the whereabouts of the Yugoslav government (last reported in Vichy dispatches to have been in Sarajevo before that city's capture) and had no news of 17-year-old King Peter II.

Likewise they were without news of Gen. Dusan T. Simovich, the anti-axis premier whose army coup d'etat on March 27 was followed by the German attack on Yugoslavia

and Greece at dawn on Sunday, April 6.

Nazi quarters pointed out, in predicting the same sort of swift collapse of Greece, that Jugoslavia—a nation of 15,700,000 persons and 93,560 square miles—had crumbled under Germany's "blitz" blows in the same manner as France, Holland, Belgium and Poland.

NEW TAXES IN ALL BRACKETS EYED FOR U.S.

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gave unanimous approval to this program.

"We reached this figure," Morgenthau said, "on the basis that we ought to raise at least two-thirds of our expenditures by taxation and one-third by borrowing."

"We figure expenditures in the coming fiscal year, beginning July 1, will be about \$19,000,000,000. Two-thirds of that is \$12,667,000,000. We figure that existing taxes, after adding \$1,000,000,000 to previous estimates on account of better business, will bring us \$9,223,000,000, leaving us \$3,444,000,000 short of the amount of taxes we ought to raise."

Even after the unprecedented new taxes are levied, Morgenthau continued, the treasury will have to borrow about \$500,000,000 a month to keep up with the huge expenditures for defense and the lease-lend program.

"An ideal way to raise this money," Morgenthau said, "would be to increase everybody's tax by one-third."

He indicated, however, that a portion of the new taxes probably would be raised from persons who paid no federal taxes this year.

GREEKS ADMIT FORCES BEING DRIVEN BACK

Today's official announcement advised the Greek people to remain calm and avoid panic in the face of the new "reverse" and shopkeepers were ordered to keep their places open. Workers were told to stay at their jobs.

An earlier announcement today by a Greek spokesman had said that the eastern end of the allied line held firm along the 100-mile Greek front and that "not one foot of Greek territory behind the Greek-British lines has fallen into enemy hands."

Nazis Wiped Out
The ministry of public security told of more German bombing attacks in the Eubian gulf region north of Athens, but without victims, and reported that two Nazi raiders had been shot down.

Two German divisions—22,000 to 30,000 men—have been wiped out in casualties in the past 10 days during mass Nazi attacks with infantry and tanks, according to an observer returning to Athens and quoted by the British radio, the CBS said.

The allied right flank extending from Katerini, some dozen miles northeast of Mount Olympus near the Gulf of Salonika, to Servia, 30 miles to the southwest, was reported to be repulsing all enemy attacks.
