

Independent Wins Election at OSC

CORVALLIS, April 24 (AP)—Oregon State college students gave a majority to Andrew Landforce, Corvallis independent, for the presidency of the student body last night.

He defeated Ron Davis, Deer Island fraternity man, by 1375 to 1347 in an election featuring a hot "Greek-Barb" campaign. The vote was the heaviest ever cast here.
