SUMMER LAKE TO GET FIRST CHURCH

Summer Lake is to have its first church building through the efforts of the Rev. J. M. B. Gill, Episcopal missionary to Lake county, who obtained from the general council of the church in New York the sum of \$3000 for the purpose. The church, to be known as "The Church of Our Savior," will be erected this spring largely by labor donated by men of the community. The site, northeast of the postoffice, was the gift of Mr. and Mrs. John Kerns. The work is to start immediately and be completed by fall.

Though Summer Lake, first settled in 1873, is one of the oldest communities in this part of the state, it has never had regular church services until the Rev. Gill established a Sunday school there in 1938 and began holding services each second and fourth Sunday in Ana River schoolhouse. From the first the attendance was good and interest encouraging, says Rev. Gill. However, the facilities of the one-room schoolhouse were so inadequate that he began to seek means of raising money for a combined church and parish house.

Last summer when illness compelled him to go east for medical treatment, he called on officers of the general church for help. From a fund known as the United Thank Offering raised by members of the woman's auxiliary to the national council a grant was made for the Summer Lake church. Bishop's committee, which is the official body of the church, is composed of Dean Harris, Les Elder, Homer Carlon, Guy Foster, Mrs. Alice Carlon and Mrs. Bernice Small, all of Summer Lake.

Rev. J. M. B. Gill is a native of Petersburg, Va., a graduate of Washington and Lee university and of the Theological Seminary of Virginia. He served 15 years as a missionary to China, 13 years as rector of St. Paul's church in Petersburg, Va. In 1937 he came to Oregon where he is located at Lakeview.
