

THREE FROM KLAMATH GET OSC HONORS

CORVALLIS, April 30 (P)— Student honors for 1941, including all-college prizes and awards for the pledging to Phi Kappa Phi, all school scholastic honor society, were announced here today.

Fifteen students received cash or other special awards and 14 were given honorable mention. Phi Kappa Phi pledged 32 seniors, 28 juniors, eight graduate students and two faculty members.
