

400 BOMBERS IN DUSK TO DAWN ATTACK

 fire was able to drive the British from Bremen and Hamburg. The RAF raiders streamed over in "constant parade," dumping their tons of bombs on specified targets.

Although Hamburg and Bremen felt the worst fury of the tens of thousands of bombs and incendiaries, bombs also fell with destructive effect upon

Berlin, Emden naval base, the Nazi U-boat lair at St. Nazaire on the French coast and other "selected" targets.

The great Blohm-Voss submarine yards at Hamburg, the Deutsche Schiff Under Maschinedau and Atlas shipyards at Bremen and "other industrial quarters" in both cities were smashed by bombs.

At Hamburg the entire wharf was set afire and a whole row of buildings was smashed by bombs with "smoke rising 10,000 feet."

The attack on Hamburg, which had been heavily bombed on Tuesday night, was its 68th of the war, while Bremen was bombed for the 65th time.

Berlin felt the blows of British bombs for the 42nd time and Emden for the 45th time.

The extent of damage caused in Berlin was not revealed but

it was indicated that the attack upon the German capital had been merely a side-show to the big attacks on the ports.

LONDON, Saturday, May 10 (UP)—German air raiders attacked northeastern, western and Midland districts of England early today, continuing the relentless bombing of ports, arms plants and RAF bases which some quarters say is the first phase of Germany's latest plan to invade Britain.

The Nazis appeared to be in fewer numbers than the two preceding nights, possibly because of the loss of 118 planes and about 400 fliers inflicted by the RAF during the first nine days of May.

Thursday night's bombings were heavy and widespread.

Hull Attacked

Liverpool and the Merseyside area Thursday night were bombed for the eighth consecutive night; the Humber (Hull) region again was heavily attacked and bombs were showered on many other districts, including London which experienced its first night raid since April 18.

Considerable damage was done despite heroic efforts of British night fighters who shot down 11 raiders, and anti-aircraft gunners who brought down two. Wednesday the British night fighters shot down a record bag of 24 raiders.

The board asked for an opinion from the attorney general's office, and this week received an interpretation of the law as applied to the local situation.

Under his opinion, the situation is as follows:
 The term of E. S. Robinson, which originally expired in 1943, is extended to June, 1945.

L. L. Truax, whose term originally expired in 1942, would draw lots with Godfrey Blohm to determine which term expires in 1943 and which in 1944.

Blohm, however, will have to stand for election, if he is to remain on the board, because he is serving out the unexpired term of J. W. Kerns, resigned.

The terms of A. M. Collier and Mrs. Burt Hawkins originally would have expired this year. However, if Collier, who has moved out of the district, resigns before election, it will automatically extend the term of Mrs. Hawkins to 1942.

Hence it appears directors will be elected to fill the positions now held by Blohm and Collier, and possibly the one held by Mrs. Hawkins.

The new directors will be elected for five-year terms.

In the county district, two directors are to be elected. The term of Harry Wilson, of the southern zone, expires, and will

be filled at the balloting. So also does the term of Rex High of the eastern zone, who has been serving out the unexpired term of C. B. Brown, deceased.

One director will be elected in the Klamath union high school district, B. F. Loftsgaard, of the Algoma sub-district, will not run for re-election, as he has moved into Klamath Falls.

The names of Freeman Schultz and Fred Hagelstein have been mentioned as possible candidates for the high school board.
