

CHURCH ZEST LIKE THAT OF HITLER URGED

PORTLAND, Ore., May 15 (AP)—A plea for the church to match the passion of communism and Hitlerism in pressing for its way of life, was voiced here Wednesday at the opening of the 23rd synod of the Episcopal Province of the Pacific.

The Rt. Rev. Karl Morgan Block, bishop of California, assailed defeatism and said that "God wants an aggressive campaign against sin and unrighteousness."

A procession of 14 bishops, 60 clergy and a choir marched into Trinity Episcopal church to open the synod at which the Rt. Rev. S. Arthur Huston, bishop of Olympia, presided.

The synod's business session opened following the service, as did the 20th session of the provincial women's auxiliary. Both will continue through Friday afternoon.

Bishop Block said the present

world conflict is "tearing up the nest of contemporary civilization" because man has put his trust in false gods including belief in automatic progress and belief in science as a new messiah.

"Unless the human achievements which we see about us are motivated by the Christian spirit, they become agents of destruction," the bishop added.

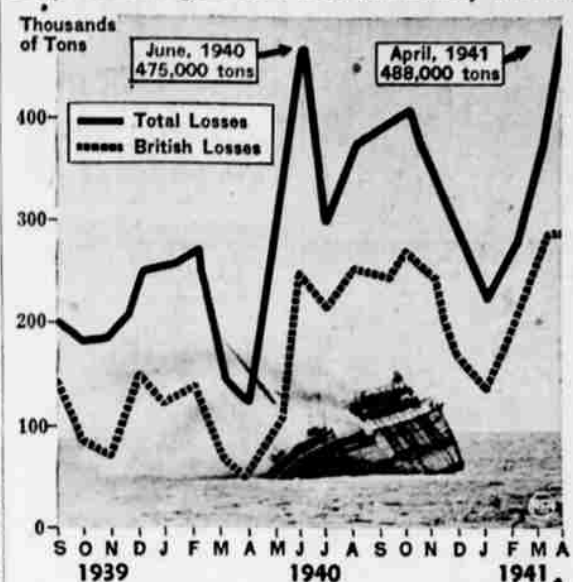
Seattle System to Be Linked With Northwest Power

SEATTLE, May 15 (AP)—The way-station of Covington, near Kent, will be the scene Sunday of a major step in the linking of the vast projected Pacific northwest power grid.

Throwing of a switch will start power from Seattle's municipally owned City Light, flowing into the Bonneville system for use in Columbia river plants. The Grand Coulee dam line is scheduled to plug in at the Covington junction in August.

Dr. Paul J. Raver, Bonneville administrator, said here yesterday that the three-way hookup "will give this area the biggest hydro-electric power output in the world. The inter-connection of City Light gives this region
