Upon arrival, the dun-colored trucks were drawn into a compact unit, and work on what was to be a 900-tent camp begun. Meanwhile tank trucks were assembled across the road for refueling the 375 army transports.

As the troops pulled in, quartermasters hurried to railroad sidings and truck depots to obtain meat and vegetables from refrigerator cars and trucks sent ahead.

The entire unit was scheduled to depart Thursday morning and another one bearing artillery will begin to roll into the city shortly after noon.
