Reclamation officials were jubilant over the reported boost in the sump project appropriation.

WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP)—To speed completion of the developments, the senate appropriations committee recommended the financing of seven reclamation projects out of the general treasury as it reported a \$185,119,000 interior department supply bill to the senate today.

The bill, as it emerged from the committee, carried \$82,726,000 for construction of western irrigation works in the next fiscal year.

The amount was \$3,792,600 more than allowed by the house, a reduction of \$3,000,000 in the house-approved total of \$34,730,000 for the California central project being more than offset by the committee's action in increasing the Grand Coulee dam appropriation to \$11,000,000 from \$8,000,000 and by other increases.

Projects the committee said should be financed out of the general treasury instead of out of a special reclamation fund which has been found inadequate, and the recommended appropriation for each were:

The committee made the following increases in house totals for various projects: Payette division of Boise project, Ida., from \$500,000 to \$1,500,000; Sun River, Mont., from \$50,000 to \$100,000; Deschutes project, Ore., from \$400,000 to \$1,000,000; Klamath project, Ore.-Calif., from \$200,000 to \$500,000.

Lou Gehrig, 'Iron Man' of Baseball, Dies in New York

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after the Bronx bombers won their fourth straight world title by defeating the Cincinnati Reds in four straight games. In respect to his long and faithful service to the club the Yankees retired his "No. 4" and gave the ball player permanent ownership of his locker in the Yankee dressing room.

On October 9, 1939, Mayor F. H. LaGuardia appointed Gehrig to a 10-year term as a member of the three-man parole commission at a salary of \$5700. Occasionally Gehrig would drop in quietly at Yankee Stadium and sit on the Yankee bench in civilian clothes during a game.

More than once during his fabulous career Gehrig played on his nerve alone. He was felled by wild pitches. He had attacks of lumbago so bad that he was unable to dress himself in his uniform. He had his feet stepped on and cut. His legs and fingers were bruised and bashed. Once he played for a period with a chipped bone in his little finger.

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U. S. HASTENS DEFENSE UNITS ON GREENLAND
