Municipal elections were held in a number of Oregon towns on Monday of last week.

British troops were surprised and defeated in a recent engagement with the Boers. The latter are trying hard to fix the English about as American troops did a hundred and some years ago, and up to date they have made effective headway in that direction.

Drighnam H. Roberts, who has been sent from Utah to become a member of the U. S. Congress, is likely never to occupy an official seat in that distinguished body. By a vote of 302 to 30, his destiny as a congressman has been consigned to the hands of a special investigating committee.

Governor Gage, of California, has been urging the importance of employing a lady physician in every insane asylum of the state, having prepared a resolution to that effect, which has been adopted by the authorized commission. Such wise action should be followed by every state in the Union.

United States Senator Hayward, of Nebraska, died at his home in Nebraska City on the 5th inst. The vacancy will be filled temporarily by an appointee of the governor, or until the legislature meets to elect his successor. The governor being a pop., he will appoint a pop. senator. G. M. Hittchcock, the calamity editor of the World-Herald, seems to stand a good chance for the place.

President McKinley's annual message, which was given to congress and the public last week, is rather voluminous, as such documents invariably are, though it is very comprehensive and handles public questions throughout with the ability and discerning judgment characteristic of the man. The president's review of the affairs of the government show them to have greatly improved within the last two years, and in fact reflect an upward and prosperous tendency in all lines. He believes Cuba should be given into the hands of the inhabitants of the island as soon as they are capable of controlling and maintaining a government there. As to the Philippines, he thinks ultimate disposition of the islands should rest with congress, it being his duty in the meantime to subdue the insurrection and restore order and peace. In regard to finance, he favors the gold standard unequivocally. In short, the message is regarded an able, statesman-like paper and has given general satisfaction.

The following is a dispatch from Hornbrook to the San Francisco Examiner, in which it was published on the 3d inst.: "A new corporation has been formed by a number of prominent business men of Northern California and Southern Oregon called the Oregon Midland Railroad Company, to construct a standard guage railroad sixty-five miles long from Klamath Falls, Oregon, to connect with the Oregon and California at Hornbrook. One of the prime movers in this enterprise is David Horn, after whom the town of Hornbrook is named, a substantial business man whose well-known energy and push bespeak success for this new road, which will tap one of the largest belts of yellow pine, sugar pine, cedar and fir on the coast, besides opening to the market thousands of acres of agricultural and grazing land. The road will follow the Klamath river all the way, making a route of easy grades and free from snow. Chief Engineer Eugene Schiller's party, numbering fifteen men, outfitted here today and will start on the preliminary survey immediately in order to be prepared for grading early next spring."
