It may also be asserted with truth that the wool produced in that county annually and to not less than 1,500,000 pounds per year will be shipped to market by way of this road. It will be the nearest standard gauge road and therefore the easiest to reach. Hence it will be patronized, not as a matter of sentiment, but as a matter of business and economy. The road at this place will make the shipping point not only for the stock, grain and lumber of Klamath county, but for a great region outside the county, and especially to the north and east, hitherto unsupplied with a convenient method of getting to market, (a field in fact embracing as many square miles as some of the eastern states) may feel safe in the belief that the traffic of the road will be no small thing. It will pay from the start, in manufacturing and other enterprises, the road will become as prosperous in business as any road in the West.
