**LOCAL NEWS.**

Charles Low, of Pine Flat, was in town Tuesday.  
Judge Smith, of Altamont, was doing business in town on Monday.  
Sheriff Kershner went to Pokenia Sunday on official business and returned Tuesday.  
R. S. Moore arrived home Friday from his month's sojourn at Selen and Portland. He had an enjoyable visit.  
Henry Jackson, the richest Indian on the reservation, was in town Sunday and Monday, accompanied by his two daughters.  
W. R. Townley and wife, of Klamath, Cal., returned on Monday from the Lakeview land office, where they went last week to obtain timber claims.  
The freight train of J. M. Moore arrived from Ager on Tuesday, bringing great quantities of new goods to gladden the hearts of Klamath Falls merchants.  
Half an inch of snow covered the ground Monday night, though it disappeared as quickly as it came. There was of course a slight frost which might have done a little harm to fruit trees.  
On Monday afternoon, a roar, like the voice of a good-sized cannon, was heard reverberating through town. It was not a salute in honor of the approaching railroad, but was merely a charge of dynamite fired off to loosen up a ledge of rock near Main street.  
C. H. Finley, an enterprising capitalist and business man of Pittsville, Wisconsin, was in town on Friday

and Saturday, looking over the country and its various attractions, resources and advantages, with an eye to the future. He will probably be here again in a few weeks.  
In reply to the hue and cry that Grants Pass is overrun with small-pox, the authorities of that city have after due investigation, announced that there is now not a single case of it in town. The two last cases have fully recovered and are out of quarantine and no new cases have been discovered.  
Mr. Van Dumlup, the gentleman who is looking after the bonus for the O. M. R. R. company, went up to Klamath Agency last week. How he is progressing in the raising of the bonus we have not heard, but presume that the work proceeds favorably. We hope so, certainly, as the future depends greatly on his efforts. If he is successful in raising the aid asked for, the road will be commenced immediately and completed without delay, and with it will come a tidal wave of prosperity.  
The primary caucus for the election of delegates to the republican county convention, was held at the court house Saturday afternoon, and was attended by a large crowd of the republican electors of this place and vicinity. The meeting was called to order by R. S. Moore, and on motion, Judge L. E. Willits was elected chairman and A. L. Leavitt secretary. The election of delegates resulted in favor of the following named gentlemen: W. A. Wright, E. S. Phillips, H. L. Boggs, C. C. Lewis, E. N. Colson, A. Turner, S. E. Martin, R. T. Baldwin, Jno. A. Uerlings, B. S. Grigsby and John Shepard. The utmost harmony prevailed throughout, and the men elected as delegates are among the best men and republicans in the county. The county convention will be held at the court house next Saturday.
