

Call For Klamath County Republican Convention and Primaries.

A republican convention for the county of Klamath is hereby called to meet at Klamath Falls on Saturday, March 31, 1900, at the hour of 10 a. m., for the purpose of nominating a county ticket and to elect four delegates to the republican state and congressional district conventions, and transact such other business as may properly come before said convention. The convention will consist of 41 delegates, apportioned among the several precincts of the county as follows:

The same being one delegate for the new precinct of Snow and one at large for each of the other precincts of the county and one delegate for each 15 votes and fraction over one-half thereof, cast for Hon. T. T. Geer for governor at the state election of 1898. Primaries will be held at the voting places in the several precincts on Saturday, March 24, 1900, at the hour of 2 o'clock p. m. of said day.
