Deputy Sheriff Parrish and Judge Orr went to Pukegama Sunday morning on legal business returning Monday afternoon. While there they sold under execution the logging railroad, cars, etc., which were bid in by the plaintiffs.

General manager Van Horn of Ashland, Treasurer Horn, of Hornbrook, Calif., and Counselor McWilliam of Ashland, all officials of the Oregon Midland Railway, arrived Monday evening, and held a business meeting on Tuesday.

J. A. McCall chief engineer and C. W. Root consulting engineer of the Oregon Midland Railroad came over from Ashland to look over the route of the road and to attend a meeting of the directors, arriving here Sunday evening.

The republican county convention of Lake county last week, nominated H. R. Dunlap for sheriff, Wm. Gunther for county clerk, and sent to the congressional convention a solid delegation for the re-nomination of Congressman Tongue.

The I. O. O. F. and Rebekah lodges of Klamath Falls will celebrate the 81st anniversary of the order on the 20th inst. Lodges at Lakeview, Bonanza, Ashland, Medford and Jacksonville have been invited to be present and assist in the celebration.

We understand that it is not so difficult to rent houses in Ashland now as it was a year ago. Our informant tells us that the owners of a large percentage of the dwellings carry the pretensions notice of "To Let" over their doors. The cause of this, we do not learn.

Rev. Edward Donnelly of the Catholic church at Ashland who has been in Klamath Falls for the past week, held services in the open house on Sunday.

The little daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Low living on Wagner Creel near Ashland met with a fearful accident last week which resulted in her death. She was playing around the house, when during the temporary absence of her mother, she fell in to a large tub of scalding water. Her screams recalled her mother, but it was too late to save her from being so scalded that her death resulted last Saturday evening. The distress of the afflicted parents excited the most heartfelt sympathy of their neighbors.

Money is being raised by subscription for races to be had at Lakeview during the first week in July. The Examiner says that \$1000 was subscribed in one day, and that the Lake county Agricultural Association agrees to double the amount subscribed, so that at least \$2000 will be up in purses for the July races.

Ashland papers report that Saturday and Sunday nights were the coldest that have been experienced the for many weeks, and that the thermometer indicated a temperature from 25 to 29 degrees. The amount of damage to fruit at Ashland and vicinity is serious, but cannot be fully determined on for several days.
