A most deplorable accident took place at Ashland on Thursday of last week, resulting in the death of Claude Parrish, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry S. Parrish, who removed to Ashland from this place a few weeks ago. On Thursday afternoon Claude and other boys, while returning from school, were jumping on wagons and riding down the street, he fell and was killed. Claude was about 8 years at the time of his death, and he was their youngest son.

### PELICAN BAY LAND.

S. B. Ormsby, superintendent of the Cascade Forest Reserve, has returned from a trip to the southern division of the reserve, where he went under orders from the General Land Department to inspect 2880 acres of land which W. A. Holt of Crystal, has petitioned to have restored to the public domain. The land in question is near Pelican Bay, an arm of Upper Klamath Lake. It is sections 9, 16 and 17; the east 1/2 of section 8; the west 1/2 of section 10, and the south 1/2 of section 3, in township 36 south, range 6 east, of Willamette meridian. This land was originally taken up by homesteaders who, when the reserve was created, let it go back to the government and took timber lands in lieu thereof. Mr. Holt now asks that it be returned to the public domain for the reason that it is very valuable for agricultural purposes. Part of the land described is marshy and covered with grass, which would make it good grazing land. The remainder is covered with a light growth of black pine, but would also furnish fair grazing.

Superintendent Ormsby is not at liberty to state what his report to the department will be. If the land should be restored to the public domain, it will enable persons to take up 2880 acres of timber land and still have this tract open to entry. As the land lies in such shape that the half sections nearest Pelican Bay practically control the entrance to the remainder of the land, there may be a scramble for entries in case the land should be restored to the public domain.

Superintendent Ormsby says that many Indians are hunting in the reserve. He is opposed to giving them this liberty, and says they should have no greater privileges than are accorded white men.—Oregonian.
