After land has been registered, no title there adverse or in derogation to the title of the registered owner shall be acquired by any length of possession. When a land title has been registered, a certificate of such registration is made, and a duplicate certificate delivered to the owner of the land. For two years this certificate shall be prima facie evidence of title, and after that time it shall be conclusive evidence."
