RAILWAYS A NECESSITY.

Editors REPUBLICAN: Will you kindly allow a commoner, through the columns of your valuable paper, to say something on the subject that is today of the highest importance to every inhabitant of Klamath county?

The pertinent question now arises, why Klamath county with an area in square miles exceeding the state of Connecticut by 1,000, with its numerous attractive resorts for the tourist, healthful and invigorating climate, unsurpassed fertility of soil, vast wealth of virgin forest, beautiful supply of water and practically unlimited water power, together with the numerous other varied resources requisite and necessary to the upbuilding of a prosperous community, should lie here dormant at the beginning of the 20th century without a railway or other adequate means of transportation?
