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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE KLAMATH FALLS FIRE DEPARTMENT.

ARTICLE 1. This organization shall be known and designated as Klamath Falls Fire Department, and all members of the organization shall be permanent residents of Klamath Falls, Oregon.

Section 1: The regular meeting of this organization shall be held on the last Monday of each month, and shall be called to order during the months of May, June, July and August at 8 o'clock p. m.; the other months of the year at 7 o'clock p. m.

Section 2: An annual meeting of this organization shall be held on the last Monday in January, for the purpose of electing officers, hearing reports, and attending to other appropriate business.

Section 3: Ten members shall constitute a quorum to transact the business of the organization.

Section 4: Notice of all meetings, drills and parades shall be published by flying the organization's meeting flag and by alarm of bell.

Section 5: Special meetings may be held upon the call of Board of Managers, or at a written request of not less than five members, which request shall distinctly state the object of the meeting.

Section 6: No business shall be transacted at special meetings, other than that for which said meeting may have been called.

his capacity. Section 6: The Sergeant-at-Arms shall keep the cards clean, attend to the meeting room, ring the call for meetings, and such other business as the Chief or President may direct.

ARTICLE 5. Section 1: All candidates for membership shall have their names presented in writing, then referred to investigating committee, then balloted on and receiving less than three black balls shall be declared elected.

Section 2: All members shall sign the Constitution and By-Laws, to be on the alert and in case of alarm of fire shall repair to their respective hose carriage and assist in conveying it to the fire, and obey all orders issued to them by their superior officers, to attend all meetings, parades, alarms and drills.

Section 3: Any member of this organization for conduct unbecoming an honorable man and a good freeman, or for actions detrimental to the reputation of this Department or of the rights of his fellow members as such, and any officer or officers of this Department for incompetency, misconduct, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office, may be impeached upon the written request of three members, and he or they shall be tried by the Board of Managers, and if found guilty shall be liable to such penalty as the board may deem proper, subject to approval or disapproval by a two-thirds vote of the organization present at such meeting.

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Section 5: Special meetings may be held upon the call of Board of Managers, or at a written request of not less than five members, which request shall distinctly state the object of the meeting.

Section 6: No business shall be transacted at special meetings, other than that for which said meeting may have been called.

Section 7: It shall be the duty of each Foreman to take command of his company at all fires, alarms, drills, parades, and all other such meetings, to see that the hose cart and all apparatus are kept in good repair, to observe that each member performs his duty, to excuse members from further attendance at fires, drills and alarms. He will report to the Chief any repairs needed to the apparatus or cart house.
