We learn that a new building, 22 by 70 feet in size, is to be erected at the Agency for the Klamath boarding school, for carpenter shop, gymnasium, band room, etc. The building last week. is to be furnished in up-to-date style. Capt. Applegate has lately been in town investigating the chances to get brick, lime and other materials, so as to commence the construction of the building without delay.


