The populists refuse to fuse with the democrats in Kansas and are preparing to call a mass convention and nominate a state ticket independent of their former ally. Thus it is gratifying to note that demopop union, regardless of principle and solely for office, will fall this year even in Kansas, the nucleus of populism, calamity and long whiskers.

Candidate W. J. Bryan has concluded his New England speech-making tour. It is not reported that he has removed any of the differences existing among democratic chiefs. If each contending leader stubbornly sticks to what he thinks is the proper thing for democracy, as now seems probable, its fabric of principles will be so shredded by the time the November election rolls around that the party's attending train of satellites won't know what they are voting for.

James Jeffries won in the eighth round in his pugilistic encounter with Robert Fitzsimmons at San Francisco last Friday. It is reported to have been a hot contest, to the delight of the 8,000 spectators. The San Francisco Examiner, however, claims that the fight was a "fake" and quotes the mayor of the town as saying he would not allow any more fights if they are to be "fakes." When a town has the good fortune to secure such a creditable exhibition as a prize fight, it should of course be genuine. Shamming and a consequent lack of brutality and blood detract from the inspiration and good feeling of the occasion. The principals and others interested, however, assert that the fight was fierce and genuine from start to finish.

Immigration agents of the Harriman railroad lines propose to make a concerted and systematic effort to advertise the Northwest and particularly Oregon and thereby increase the influx of homeseekers from the East. It is proposed to gather reliable statistics and general information and publish them in pamphlets, to be circulated among Eastern people who contemplate changing locations. The printed matter will be fresh and of varied interest and the supply will be abundant. Besides, agents will be sent into different sections of the East to arouse interest in the Coast and induce immigration. Much to the credit of Ashland, the board of trade there has made provision to furnish 100,000 copies of a circular setting forth the resources of that town and Southern Oregon. In this connection it is well to add that Klamath county has a variety of sub-

stantial resources and attractions which should not be neglected in this great advertising enterprise, but we cannot expect them to receive much, if any, attention unless our people take steps looking to that end. By a union of effort, this can and should be done with little expense.

# AN ALL ELECTRIC ROAD.

In remembering with pride the many other resources and natural advantages of Klamath county, we should not overlook the incalculable value of the energy possible from the various falls and rapids in Klamath river. Not only may these be utilized for filling reservoirs for irrigating purposes, but there is enough such power going to waste in this town and near Keno, a few miles below here, to form the backbone of an all-electric railroad system from Sacramento, Calif., to The Dalles in Oregon—or more properly speaking, from tide water at San Francisco to tide water at Astoria.

So far as the REPUBLICAN is concerned, this idea is original with us, and we have not consulted the existing railroads for permission to exploit it. We feel that nature has put in the foundation broad and deep for such an enterprise and that the company which occupies this field, will not only prove itself a benefactor to a most deserving class of pioneers and natives, but will earn large dividends as well, and become a powerful factor in the development of one of the best portions of Oregon.

That electricity is destined to be the motive energy of the near future, no student of economics will deny. That its generation by the gravity system or natural water power is the process of "minimum cost," is equally axiomatic. Hence it follows that Klamath county holds the key to a project, which, if properly handled would redeem this section and give the world a profitable and significant example of the transition from steam to electricity, in the matter of hauling America's mammoth commerce and growing passenger traffic.

A glance at the natural resources mentioned, will convince the thinking mind of the practicability of the project. The Sacramento river above Red Bluffs, abounds in rapids and falls. These would furnish energy enough from the California line to Sacramento, or tide water. The Klamath river within a distance of fifteen miles furnishes energy equivalent to 300,000 horse-power, which would take up the system at the California line and supply it more than abundantly until the Deschutes river is reached. The longest distance between sources of energy would be that occupied by the Klamath marsh, which is a mere bagatelle compared to distances electricity is now covering, by transmission, in California and British Columbia. Once on the Deschutes, this turbulent and precipitous stream would do

its full quota in extending the system to The Dalles district. Here the road could establish a terminus or it might find a right of way down the Columbia to the sea; in which case all the energy desired could be produced from the limitless power of the Columbia.

To those familiar with the territory that would thus be brought in contact with the modern, busy, outside world, by such an all-electric system, there remains not the shadow of a doubt but that it would prove one of the most important industrial enterprises which could come to that great and practically undeveloped section east of the Cascades, a portion of which is still referred to as "The Oregon Desert."

# KLAMATH RAILROAD.

(Yreka Journal.)

The new steel bridge across the Klamath, about thirteen miles up the river from Klamath and one mile below Fall creek, has been completed, for the crossing of trains as soon as the track is ready. A large force of graders are now working on the north side of the river, and the surveyors are busy in viewing out the best grade up toward Shovel creek for connection with the railroad into the woods from that point. As soon as this connection is made, it will be an easy matter to continue on to Klamath lake in Southern Oregon. When the road is completed to connect with the logging road at head of river, logs will be hauled by rail to the mills contemplated at Laird's ranch, south of Klamath, recently purchased by the Pogeama Sugar Pine Lumber Co., for which the ground has been leveled off, and some of the apparatus already delivered. The new mill town is destined to become one of the liveliest and most prosperous in the county, as box factories, house furnishing lumber and other wood work establishments in addition to two extensive saw mills, are to be added. With this addition to the lumbering business of Siskiyou, including other new mills at various points, the lumber output of Siskiyou may possibly be doubled within the next year or two.
