MR. HOLMAN'S LETTERS.

Alfred Holman, the brilliant staff writer of the Oregonian, has contributed some excellent articles to the columns of this paper, relating to Klamath and Lake counties, through which he made a tour recently. In his series of articles Mr. Holman has set forth the resources, development and present needs of the country graphically and in detail. He has dealt at length with the subject of irrigation, showing what has been done in creating luxuriant fields of alfalfa by the artificial aid of irrigation and what can be done in the future in reclaiming and making productive almost limitless areas of land by utilizing the exhaustless supply of water at hand in the lakes and streams. Mr. Holman has devoted considerable space to the stock industry, showing the exceptional adaptability of the country for the business and its future growth by the increased use of alfalfa. The timber resources have been fully brought out. In one reference to the timber, he says:

"Taking the whole area into consideration, the quantity of timber is very great. Under the conditions which prevail in the lumber market, this resource is not going to be permitted much longer to lie undisturbed."

Like most strangers who visit this country, Mr. Holman is surprised that a section so rich in resources and possibilities, has not heretofore been connected with the outside world by railroads. But he sees railroads approaching this hitherto isolated region and tries to impress Portland with the importance of securing the initial connection via the Columbia Southern and thus gaining business which now goes to San Francisco. He rightly thinks that transportation facilities are the first essential and that with their introduction the lake country will experience an era of wonderful growth. Following is the introductory paragraph in Mr. Holman's article on railroads:

"The thing that is plainly here is an established stock industry which turns off 20,000 head of beef steers each season, a wool industry which gives to commerce the product of 100,000 head of sheep, an acreage of land capable, under development, of five times its present production, and a timber field as great as that of Clatsop, Columbia and Tillamook counties combined. And if there be not at Portland the spirit of enterprise to make its own virgin field so great and obviously potential, then we ought to put up the shutters and take down our sign."

The Oregonian deserves the gratitude of this country for its efforts to make known our resources and possibilities. The work of its representative should and doubtless will result in much lasting good.
