It is promised that the trusts will be attacked at the present session of congress.

The fifty-eighth congress will consist of 208 republicans and 178 democrats—a sufficient majority to keep the congress in serene subjection.

Congress met on Monday when President Roosevelt's annual message was presented. A summary of that document will appear in this paper next week.

Let us have a railroad and more land under irrigation and our resources will develop rapidly and new commercial and industrial enterprises will follow in quick succession.
