John Barrett of Portland has been appointed by President Roosevelt minister to Japan to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Minister Buck.

President Roosevelt expresses his intention to attend the opening of the St. Louis exposition next April, and after doing so continue his trip to the Pacific coast.

Thomas Brackett Reed, ex-speaker of the house of representatives, and a man of exceptional brains and rare talent, died at his temporary quarters in the Arlington Hotel, Washington, Saturday night. Mr. Reed was a native of Maine and had reached the age of 63 years. He was long conspicuous in public life and was regarded one of the ablest statesmen in America.

President Roosevelt's message, which appears in an abridged form on the first page of this paper, is justly considered a very able document, comprehending, as it does, a fair and judicious treatment of all the questions now before the public. The message comes from a man who is conscientious, wise and progressive in thought, and who speaks frankly, honestly and impartially what he thinks. It is plainly evident that he seeks fairness for all classes and has the single purpose of promoting the welfare of the whole nation. The message should be read by everybody.

If there were fewer religious denominations, they would receive more substantial support, and preachers, better paid, would be inspired to greater effort. This would not detract from the church as an agency of good. On the contrary, it is reasonable to expect that a close union of strength, with an able clergy, stimulated to be such by freedom from pecuniary needs and hardships, would enlarge the resulting benefits. A decrease in denominations would be especially desirable in small towns, where there are apt to be several churches, more or less enfeebled by insufficient funds to carry out their mission, while one, simply sustained, would no doubt flourish in strength of influence and beneficial results. Denominations are multiplied by reason of differences over non-essentials. ### SECRETARY HITCHCOCK INTERVIEWED.

Congressman Tongue had a conference with Secretary Hitchcock on Saturday in regard to the land situation in Oregon. In speaking of the conference to an Oregonian reporter, Mr. Tongue says:

"The Secretary told me that there are no more attempted evasions of the land laws in Oregon than in other states where timber is becoming valuable; that the violations of the timber and stone act in that state are not being made by citizens of Oregon, but principally by persons who are coming in from other states. 'I was unable to find that a single officer of any Land Office in the First Congressional District, or any official whose appointment I have recommended, is under a suspicion of misconduct. If there are any, the department declines to give me information upon the subject. 'I asked the Secretary that at the earliest possible moment he localize and specify his charges, pointing out both the offenses and offenders, so that innocent men can be freed from suspicions. The Secretary said he recognized the justice of that, and will comply with my request at the earliest possible moment. 'I could learn of nothing that would place any member of the State Land Board under suspicion. Secretary Hitchcock says there is nothing on record or in any way known to his department that in the slightest degree involves any members of the delegation in conniving at or having any knowledge of any misconduct or any intended evasion of the land laws, or being in any way negligent in the discharge of duties in reference to them.

"I asked the Secretary that at the earliest possible moment he localize and specify his charges, pointing out both the offenses and offenders, so that innocent men can be freed from suspicions. The Secretary said he recognized the justice of that, and will comply with my request at the earliest possible moment. 'I could learn of nothing that would place any member of the State Land Board under suspicion. ### GAME WARDEN'S REPORT.

Game and Forestry Warden Quimby has filed his fourth annual report in the office of the governor. In it he recommends the following changes in the game laws:

First—Absolute prohibition of sale of upland birds.

Second—Shortening open season for upland birds 15 days.

Third—Prohibition of Spring shooting.

Fourth—Reducing the number of ducks that may legally be killed in a day from 50 to 25.

Fifth—Reducing the number of trout that may be caught in a day from 125 to 50.

Sixth—Erection and maintenance of screens at head of canals and water ditches.

Seventh—Establishment of a trout hatchery.

Eighth—Removal of restrictions from killing geese.

Ninth—Removal of protection to black bass.

Tenth—Increase of bounty on cougars and wildcats from \$2 to \$5.

Eleventh—Bounty on crows.

Twelfth—Increase in penalties for violations of game laws.

Thirteenth—More rigid trespass enabling

### SALT MARSH IN LAKE COUNTY.

W. H. McCall has taken about 200,000 pounds of salt off of his marsh in Lake county this year and proposes to gather 200,000 pounds more this winter. Speaking of this valuable enterprise, the Examiner says, in part:

There is very little cost in getting the salt; three men can pile up 100,000 pounds in a week, and then all that is to be done is to sack, weigh and haul to market. The salt is delivered at Lakeview for 11 cents. In an ordinary year 500,000 pounds can be taken off the marsh, and in a dry year there is much more. Last year there were fully 800,000 pounds. This salt marsh has been known and used by the Silver Lake stock men for more than a dozen years, and it was only last year that Mr. McCall filed on the marsh. This salt is much better and purer than that usually found in salt marshes, as the little lake is fed by salt springs. Six gallons of the water when boiled will make four gallons of fine, pure table salt. Mr. McCall will put up a small evaporating plant next season, and if it works satisfactorily will put up a large plant and furnish this whole section with salt. The stock salt is much better taken out in large chunks as it forms in the bottom of the lake when the water evaporates in the summer.
