The Oregon legislature met for organization on Monday. The U. S. senatorship is as yet in a tangle of uncertainty, there being several active candidates and each doubtless confident of victory.

On the organization of the house of representatives at Salem on Monday, Hon. R. A. Emmitt of Klamath county was elected temporary chairman by acclamation. Klamath county was also remembered by the appointment of C. I. Roberts to a clerkship.

On the organization of the Oregon legislature Monday, George C. Brownell of Clackamas county was elected president of the senate, and L. T. Harris of Lane county speaker of the house. At the close of the organization, both houses adjourned out of respect to the memory of the late Congressman Tongue.

The pupils from both rooms marched to the cemetery, a distance of one-fourth of a mile. It was the largest and most sympathizing crowd ever assembled on such an occasion.
