It is suspected that Judge Geo. T. Baldwin of this place is in the democratic congressional incubator and that he is apt to be pitted against the republican victor in the forthcoming contest.

A bill has been introduced in the Legislature providing that screens be put at the head of irrigating and other ditches to prevent fish from getting into them. As few fish can

ter such ditches and as screens would add to the expense of irrigation, Klamath county would naturally be opposed to the proposed law. Rubbish will quickly accumulate with a screen and unless a man is kept on hand to clear it away it would stop the flow of water. Klamath county wants no law that tends to hinder irrigation enterprises.

According to the Oregonian, Representative Emmitt has introduced a bill to impose a license tax on sheep that graze in counties other than where they are regularly assessed and taxed. Owners of sheep who take their flocks to summer range in another county than the one in which they pay taxes must first secure license to do so from the stock inspector of the county where the summer range is located. If the sheep are free from disease the stock inspector is empowered to issue the license.

The cost of the license is to be 15 cents per head. Drivers are to drive the sheep toward their destination not less than six miles per day.

### EMMITT MAKES A STR.

Salem correspondence in Portland Oregonian: The first genuine excitement of the session was kicked up in joint convention today by Representative Emmitt of Klamath, Lake and a few other counties. About the time the senators were due to arrive, Mr. Emmitt was seized with a burning desire to go outside and see how the dome of the capitol looked in a real Oregon rain storm. The observation required more time than the Eastern Oregon representative had expected, and by the time he had fully satisfied his curiosity the balloting for senator had begun. When he reached the door of representative hall, it was to find that the lobby was packed. It required no little maneuvering and strategy to get through the crowd. When Emmitt was about half way in, the clerk reached his name on roll call.

"Here!" responded the Klamath county legislator in a tone that fairly assaulted the ceiling and started the dormant echoes into life. In the confusion everybody thought he had said "Geer!" and the Fulton forces were fairly paralyzed. President Brownell, who was trying to read something or other, gave a startled look over his glasses at Speaker Harris, and the latter turned a visible crimson. The entire Fulton contingent turned in their chairs and the Geer people began to smile. They had made a real accession at last. Chief Clerk Moorhead stopped and whispered to Chief Clerk Jennings, and the latter shook his head doubtfully. By this time Emmitt had reached the bar of the house and Clerk Jennings thought he would better make sure.

"Emmitt!" he again called. "We are now voting on United States Senator," interjected President Brownell, who had managed to secure a firmer grasp on himself. Emmitt did not respond at once, and stood looking uncertainly about the house. He finally responded: "In that case I desire that my vote be recorded for Hon. Charles W. Fulton." The President sighed with relief, the Fulton men composed their agitated features, the Geer people ceased grinning, and things went on the even tenor of their way.

### LETTER FROM SALEM.

SALEM, ORE., Feb. 1, 1903. Editor Klamath Republican: If there is more of one thing than another here it is rain and mud. There is great commotion at the capitol about electing a senator, but Fulton seems to be the favorite. Some think that Booth will be the dark horse in the wind-up. Several bills have been presented in regard to sheep and cattle running on the range, but none of them is satisfactory. Mr. Bureleigh of Waldora introduced two bills. Both were condemned by the committee. Mr. Emmitt has been working on a bill which will meet with favor all around, but it is not altogether satisfactory to the cattle men. However, it is the very best we could do, as it was that or nothing. There are a lot of sheep men here from Eastern Oregon, working like beavers for the sheep business. All we could do at present is to tax them. I think Emmitt's bill will pass both houses next week. There are a good many Southern Oregon people here. Klamath county is coming to the front. They are talking railroad, irrigating ditches, etc. It is very cold and snowing here now. I was in the pen the other day. I saw Mr. Lisky and Waters from Klamath county. They are looking fine. I saw one copy of the Klamath Republican at Mr. Liston's. I think I will start for Ashland to-day. The water has been very high here. I saw Mr. Kelly of the Booth, Kelly Co. He said they had lost a large number of logs on account of the high water. The town is deserted on Saturdays. The representatives and senators scatter out. Most of them go to Portland until Monday. Charley Roberts is here, very busy with the female clerks.
