### Call For Republican Convention.

Whereas, a writ of election has been issued by the state of Oregon, ordering a special election to be held on Monday, June 1st, A. D., 1903, in the First congressional district for the purpose of electing a representative in congress for said district, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before said convention. The convention will be composed of 39 delegates, apportioned among the several precincts of the county as follows: Linkville, 10; Tule Lake, 5; Lost River, 3; Langell Valley, 2; Sprague River, 2; Dairy, 4; Wood River, 4; Plevna, 3; Snow, 3; Poe Valley, 2; and Klamath Lake, 1; the same being 1 delegate at large for each precinct, and 1 delegate for each 18 votes or fraction thereof over one-half cast for Hon. F. I. Dunbar, at the last state election, held in 1902.

Primaries will be held in the various precincts of the county, March 26th, 1903, at the usual voting places in said precincts, at the hour of 2 o'clock p. m. of said day.

Hon. Binger Hermann is believed to be in the lead for the republican congressional nomination. He stands high in the estimation of people of Klamath county and his nomination would prove very acceptable to them.

Governor McBride has vetoed the bill, passed by the Washington legislature, to make an appropriation for an exhibit at the Lewis and Clark fair. But the people of that state are very much interested in the proposed fair, and will see that there is an ample exhibit, notwithstanding the action of their governor.

According to an article published in a recent number of the Saturday Evening Post, most congressmen are pretty small potatoes in the circles at Washington. A great majority of them accomplish little aside from voting, drawing their salaries and distributing garden seeds in their respective districts to make their constituents think they are doing things. A small minority run the business, but must do it right in order to hold the approval of the big aggregation of satellites. Brains, discretion, integrity, force and experience make leaders and not many possess all those qualities.

The report of the commission appointed by President Roosevelt last October to investigate the anthracite coal strike has been made public and is considered a victory for the miners. In brief, as reported in the Oregonian, the commission awards a general increase of wages amounting in most instances to 10 per cent; some decrease of time; the settlement of all disputes by arbitration; fixes a minimum wage and a sliding scale; provides against discrimination of persons by either the mineowners or the miners on account of membership or non-membership in a labor union; provides that the awards made shall continue in force until March 31, 1906. The commission discussed to some extent the matter of recognition or non-recognition of the miners' union, but declined to make any award on this measure. Miners have signified their satisfaction over the findings of the commission. The mine owners, on the other hand, haven't much to say as yet. In accordance with the increase in wages, nearly \$3,000,000 will be added to the aggregate amount paid the miners.
