The Ashland State Normal School, mention of which is made elsewhere in this issue, under the efficient management of President Mulkey has taken rank among the leading educational institutions of the Pacific coast and should receive the hearty support of the entire southern portion of the state. The situation of this school is both pleasing to the eye of the beholder and by reason of the interesting and attractive topography surrounding it well calculated to stimulate in the mind of the student a true love of nature; its elevation of 2000 feet above sea level takes it out of the malarial belt and with the abundant supply of excellent water coming from the mountain fastnesses and pure air insures both health and vigorous incentive to study; the social influences surrounding the school are equal to the best and superior to many, the climate while healthful and invigorating is mild without the lassitude so common to lower elevations and more southern climes; in point of accessibility Ashland has many advantages, being the end of a division on the main line of the S. P. railroad with stage lines branching out in all directions. In view of these many natural advantages and the splendid work of this school during the past year, with the immediate benefits accruing to its graduates, it is to be hoped that in future the school may receive the moral and substantial support of the entire surrounding country tributary thereto.

OUR IMPRESSIONS.
At this season the prophetic sage cautiously lifts aside the curtains of the future and then solemnly announces in a low breath, that crops will be short and that a hard winter is just ahead. His manner is impressive. He prods people to prepare for the worst and that is an eminently wise thing to do.

Gossiping and attending to our neighbors' business furnish good mental gymnastics and doubtless prevent many a "thinker" from lapsing into permanent stagnation. The mind needs exercise the same as one's limbs or a horse, and without thrashing over the affairs of our neighbor and circulating an occasional morsel of gossip some of us might drop into a sad plight. Thus, gossiping, odious as it may be, is not wholly void of good.

Thieves and thugs have been infesting Portland of late and the police and detective forces have not made a very brilliant success at the business of capturing them. Therefore, people going to that city will do well to carry little money and avoid side streets and back alleys. Particularly, bankers, newspaper men and other capitalists, going to Portland, should not have in hand their usual amount of cash and should stick to populous centers.

What generous boons to education come from the lavish hands of Rockefeller, and what a source of comfort it is to know that the substantial outpourings of his philanthropic heart will not seriously impair his resources nor ultimately land him in the poor house. All he has to do to raise gifts for colleges is to squeeze up the price of oil, and how thankful consumers of illuminating fluid should be to meet the slight advance, when it is considered that great educational institutions are thereby enabled to thrive and increase their fitness for instilling text book lore into American youths.
