KLAMATH PROSPEROUS.

Alfalfa Will Average \$6.50 to \$7 and Grain is Selling at 90 Cents a Bushel.

Definite reports of the grain crop in Klamath county will soon be obtainable. There will be a good crop of grain as well as hay this year and the price is also good.

Good land under the ditch is now being sold at from \$30 to \$50 an acre. At the prices being paid this year the same land put into alfalfa would clear each year about \$19 or \$20 an acre, or, at a valuation of \$50 an acre, a profit of nearly 40 per cent.

MINES NEAR LAKEVIEW.

Surface Rock that Goes \$15 Per Ton Causes a Big Rush to File On Claims Near Town.

Considerable excitement and no small amount of interest is being manifested in the discovery recently of valuable quartz rock, and twenty or more claims have been filed in the Clerk's office in the last week.

James E. Hughes, a mining expert of Fresno, Cal., upon the recommendation of J. M. Weisner, came here a month ago and was so favorably impressed with the rock that he immediately filed a claim alongside of Weisner's in Sec. 36, Tp. 38 S. R. 20 E.

Weisner & Hughes have christened their mine the Juniper Mining Claim, and they are going to sink a shaft without delay.

The Examiner is not conversant sufficiently with the facts to express an opinion in regard to the mines. However if the opinion of those who are in a position to know are satisfied with the prospect, it certainly looks good to us.

DEATH OF B. J. PENGRA.

B. J. Pengra, pioneer politician and railway promoter of Oregon, died at the home of his son, W. J. Pengra, near Coburg, Lane county, Friday, at the advanced age of 80 years, 7 months and three days.

Deceased came to Oregon in 1853. In 1858 he came prominently in the public eye as an elector for Lincoln and Hamlin, for whom he stumped the state. Later he centered the energies of his indomitable will and resourceful mind upon railway promotion schemes.

When news of this victory reached Pengra it almost unbent his mind, and after his compact with Collis P. Huntington to build a competing line fell through, it was the last straw and he was confined at the State insane asylum for some time.
