The New Year will soon be here, the time for new resolutions, when old habits are cast off and a new life begun. No individual is so good but what he may be better. This is also true of a town or city. Every one will admit that our town is not what it ought to be, but is there one who stops to think who is to blame. You will hear fault being found with the streets, roads, sidewalks and dozens of other things, which are termed a disgrace to the city. Did you ever stop to think that each individual citizen was responsible for that disgrace? No one man more so than another. It is no excuse to say "Oh, well, it cannot be helped." The people of this town should get together, organize and be ready to intelligently consider the many important matters that are bound to come up during the next year. We are living in an age where we must do something. We cannot wait for things to happen as that has been the trouble in the past. We have waited too long already, and besides, things never happen. Klamath Falls needs an organized club of the business men, men who will work for the development of our town and county. It matters not what they are called, whether Board of Trade or Chamber of Commerce, or any of the dozens of other terms. We can have a railroad in here by next year, but don't deceive yourselves with the idea that it is going to be built anyway, for it never will be unless the citizens of Klamath county get together and approach the railroad people in the proper manner and be ready to consider any reasonable proposition they may offer. We also need an irrigation canal to water the Klamath basin and several miles of crushed rock road on either side of the town and throughout the county. These matters of public interest should be thoroughly discussed and gone over, for only in that way can we arrive at the best results. It is not right to expect three or four men whom we elect to take full responsibility in these matters. Officials are simply elected to carry out the wishes of the people, but the people first must show what their wishes are before they can condemn the action or non-action of their representatives.

NEW SCHEDULE.

The Ashland Mail Will Now Reach Here 13 Hours Later Than Heretofore.

Postmaster Murdoch has received notice of the following new schedule of departures and arrivals of the mail on route 73438 ordered to take effect Dec. 24, 1903, which has been changed to supply Pokegama.

Leave Ashland daily at 5:00 A. M.
Arrive at Klamath Falls, next day by 2:10 P. M.
Leave Klamath Falls, daily at 8:00 P. M.
Arrive at Ashland next day by 3:10 P. M.

Mr. Murdoch states that he has also been ordered to discontinue the brass locks on the mail sacks after Jan. 1, but has received no information as to whether mail will be carried over the new railroad or not. It is supposed however that all southern mail will be taken out at Pokegama and transferred to the Klamath Lake R. R.

LEGISLATORS MEET.

The extraordinary session of the Oregon Legislature called by Governor Chamberlain to remedy errors in the enactment of the new tax law at the last regular session, convened at the capitol building in Salem Monday morning, December 21.

Organization was effected with Geo. C. Brownell as president of the Senate and L. T. Harris as Speaker of the House. All other officers of the Assembly are also the same as at the regular session in January last except the position of sergeant-at-arms of the Senate is held by Judge G. P. Terry in place of A. W. Gowan, recently appointed register of the U. S. land office at Burns.

Both houses met at 11 o'clock in joint session in the Hall of Representatives to listen to the Governor's message.

In caucus the Republicans decided by a vote of 26 to 24 to adjourn Wednesday night; a vote to reconsider this action was defeated, 26 to 25. It was agreed to adopt this order of legislation: Tax Law, Hanging Law, Portage Road, and Celilo Canal; recording fees, car shortage and railroad rates, flat salaries for state officials.
