A ROCK CRUSHER. The Town Board of Klamath Falls Contracts for a Road or Street Making Plant.

At a special meeting held last Thursday April 21, the town council entered into a contract with The National Drill and Manufacturing Company of Chicago, through their special representative Mr. W. O. Gorman, for a complete street making plant which will cost \$4225.

The plant consists of a first class National rock crusher to cost \$1250; a 21-horse power traction engine to cost \$2100; a revolving screen for grading rock after it is crushed, to cost \$175; an elevator attachment to cost \$200; and a five ton roller to cost \$500.

The plant was ordered shipped as soon as ready and it is expected it will be here by July. The company agrees to set up and operate the plant in Klamath Falls sufficient time to demonstrate its efficiency and working order. The jaws of the crusher will open at the top 10 inches and are 18 inches deep and are capable of crushing a rock 16x16 inches. The capacity of the machine is from 10 to 20 tons an hour which will insure about 100 tons of crushed rock a day.
