BRITT LOSES
ON A FOUL.

Jimmy Britt defeated Champion Joe
Gans decisively in the Mechanics' Pa-
villion in San Francisco Monday night,
but under the decision of Referee Graney
the fight went on a foul.

Gans was outboxed, outfought and
outgamed by the wonderful Californian,
and secured the hollow honors of a vic-
tory by a decision which is not in ac-
cordance with the rules of the ring.

The two boxers and the referee each
contributed his mite to bring about this
result. Joe Gans deliberately went to
his knees in the fourth round, when he
saw the tide of battle going against him.
Britt, who was fighting like a cage full
of tigers, struck him while he was down.

Referee Graney made the mis-
take which had the effect of starting an
incident that a few minutes afterward,
instead of warning Gans that he must
not go down without being hit, the ref-
eree paid all his attention to Britt. He
warned the Californian that he must
not hit Gans when he was down. The
end came in a sensational manner in
the fifth round. Britt's fighting blood
was at fever heat and he threw disre-
spect to the winds and sailed into Gans
with irresistible force. The latter could
make no stand against the onslaught
and in just thirty-eight seconds he went
to his knees.

Instead of appealing to the referee,
Britt struck Gans several blows with
left and right to the head. The house
was in an uproar. Referee Graney re-
fused to Gans, signifying that the col-
ored man had won. When it was
announced that he had lost on a foul he
was frantic with rage. He rushed at
the referee and struck him a hard blow
on the jaw. There was a clinch and
the referee and his assistants were on
the floor while the crowd leaped into
the ring from every corner and dragged
them apart. After they were separated
Graney walked away, but his anger
did not abate. He was seen to
Tuxedo and started in the direction of
Britt. Friends caught him and led him
to one side.
