

ORGANIZATION OF THE WATER USERS

FILED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Capital Stock Placed at Two Million --One Hundred Thousand Shares at Twenty Dollars Each.

The Klamath Water Users' Association has been incorporated. The capital stock has been placed at \$2,000,000--100,000 shares at \$20 per share.

No cash payment of stock is required. Payments on water rights will be considered also as payment on the stock.
