D. B. Worthington Will Again Visit Klamath.

The Publisher of the Daily News will leave next week for the Klamath Lake country in Southern Oregon, where he lived for a number of years. Incidentally he will visit San Francisco and the Portland exposition.

The Klamath country is a part of the largest area in the United States not penetrated by a railroad, although three lines are pointing in that direction and the completion of one road is assured, a hundred thousand dollar bonus having been raised. The country is the paradise of the artist, the sportsman and the seeker after the remnant of color still left in the great west. It has towering mountain peaks, wide valleys, sparkling lakes and streams, dense forests of pine, broad grazing lands—and an Indian reservation. It can easily embrace all these the county being nearly a hundred miles square.

Crater Lake, in the extreme north end, is a body of water eight miles in diameter in the crater of an extinct volcano. The walls—near perpendicular—are of basaltic rock and are 2,000 feet high and the water in the lake is 2,100 feet deep. Heavy snows nine months in the year give the water supply. The outlets are subterranean, and a score of miles away the water gushes out from the foothills and forms creeks that lead to river and lake, on to the ocean. These creeks are as clear as molten crystal, the waters are eight degrees above freezing point the year round and are filled with the rainbow species of trout weighing as high as fifteen pounds.

In the southern part of the county is a small stream known as Lost river and in the spring of the year the run of the suckers is so great that teams have difficulty in fording the stream. Indians from the reservation bring the fish out of the river with pitchforks, dry them in the sun and use them as food for months. At least these conditions existed twelve years ago. The trout streams—mostly in the reservation—were whipped so outrageously by San Francisco fishermen that the Indian agent restricted their catches. One summer a party of four wealthy Californians, who visited Klamath county every summer with their French cook—caught a ton of trout, and the region was so remote they could not ship them, even to friends.

One story concerning the natural curiosities of the Klamath country will be related here, and it is absolutely true although generally received with more or less shrugging of the shoulders until Miss Ryan of Appleton—a sister of Dudley Ryan of Beloit—verified the tale on one of her visits here. Miss Ryan is a newspaper girl who, with a companion, took up a timber claim and homestead in Klamath county and profited to the extent of \$5,000 or \$6,000 by just exercising a little independence and American spirit.

This story deals with toads and snakes—both harmless. Bordering the town just south of Klamath Falls is a bay formed by the Klamath river, which flows through the town just as Rock river does through Beloit. In early June of each year thousands—tens of thousands—of toads no bigger than a cent piece come up from the "tules"—or rushes—and some instinct impels them to move, or rather hop up the river and across the main street of the town. This makes it disagreeable for the pedestrian, and wagons crush hundreds of them. Just north of the town the river bank is high and rocky and here in sunny days lie great masses of river snakes. It is one of the sights of the country. Like the lilies they toil not. They simply open their mouths and gobble all the toads that go up the river—and they make a perfect job of it. A toad is rarely seen a mile north of Klamath Falls. News-papersmen in Portland some years ago related these stories which were so generally disbelieved that photographs were brought into play to prove them.

Twenty miles south of Klamath Falls are the lava beds where was fought the war with the Modoc Indians in 1872. Capt. Jack, three other chiefs and a comparatively small band of renegade Indians held off Uncle Sam's troops for a long period and treacherously killed the peace commission sent on from Washington. The four chiefs were afterward hanged and their graves are at Fort Klamath, at which no troops have been stationed for many years. A thrilling spectacle was a sham battle fought twelve years ago at old Fort Klamath between the Klamath and Modoc on the one side and a company of infantry and a troop of cowboy cavalry on the other. The incident would have furnished Remington rare material for his color pictures.

Klamath Falls has hot springs within its limits. A mile north is a lake sixty feet higher than the town, furnishing marvelous water power. The lake is thirty-five miles long and six miles wide—the home of all manner of wild fowl and fish. The forests surrounding are abundant with big game. The railroad is reaching for the country. The government is instituting a vast irrigation project. It's a country worth visiting before civilization follows the iron horse and makes it more commonplace and gives it over to commerce—and the white shirt.—Beloit Daily News.
