Good Times For Sheep Men.

since the last issue of the Herald:
D. Dalton bought 1200 head of Geo.
Hankins, 500 head of Pat Murphy,
and about 800 of Dick Quinlan.

Antone Hendryx bought about 2000
stock and mutton sheep from Kingry
Bros.

Louis Gerber bought about 600 mutton
sheep from Henry Leehman. Mr.
Gerber started about 3700 head to
Montague on Monday.

Champaign bought about 1000 head
from parties in Warner.

D. Dalton bought 1400 from Mrs.
Reid of New Pine Creek.

Dave Edler sold 2000 yearling ewes
and weathers to some Frenchmen.

D. Dalton will start about 6000
head to the lower country in about 10
days.

H. P. Enquist on Tuesday sold
about 2400 one, two and three year
olds to E. C. West of Tacoma, Wash.
The price was \$2.50 and \$3.00. Mr.
Enquist had exceptionally good sheep
and received the highest price report-
ed.--The sheep will be shipped to
Tacoma and will be in charge of Mr.
Enquist and Dan Malloy.

It is safe to say that about 60,000
head of Lake county sheep have al-
ready been sold and that many more
will be sold in the next few weeks.

Several other deals are under con-
sideration and indications are for
heavy sales during the coming week.
The prices being paid are practically
the same as those paid when the mar-
ket first opened, ranging from \$2 to
\$2.75.

Most of the Lake county wool is
now sold only a few thousand pounds
remain unsold. The highest price
that has been paid for Lake county
wool was 20 cents at the corral. It
is estimated that about \$400,000 came
into Lake county this year from wool
alone.
