situation with Mr. Campbell and our legal adviser, relative to the position of our company in the controversy, and became more than ever convinced that our position was perfectly secure, resting on our franchise granted by the City, hence work progressed vigorously and without cessation.

An interview between Mr. W. K. Brown, representing the Klamath Canal Co., and myself, representing the interests of the Klamath Development Co. and our other enterprises, has resulted in an arrangement whereby the Klamath Development Co., completes the work now open on Main street, putting said street west of 7th street in good serviceable condition, between 7th street and Payne alley, thereafter and up to July 15th our work will be pushed forward on Main street east of 7th street.

In the meantime, Mr. A. H. Naftzger, President of the Klamath Development Co. will return from the East, and it is hoped some arrangement can be made whereby the Klamath Canal Co. may enter into some arrangement with us for the use of our rails on some satisfactory rental basis, or in any manner approved by Mr. Naftzger.

It is perhaps needless to add here, that the growth and development of Klamath Falls and Klamath county together with adjacent territory tributary to our railway is of vast importance to our stockholders. We are, therefore, deeply concerned in aiding and assisting by every honorable means, all worthy citizens in their efforts to bring people into Southern Oregon.

To the end that the permanent growth of the region our line will serve may be rapid and substantial, we ask the hearty co-operation of all parties. But no matter what may happen in the way of hindrances or interferences on the part of any who may misunderstand our true mission, as it is understood by the far-seeing ones looking with prophetic eye to a grand future, the die is cast; we are wedded to the fairest commercial daughter in the realm (Southern Oregon) and her care and welfare for years that are to come are our chiefest concern.

Mr. Farragher Speaks.  
James H. Farragher, attorney for the Klamath Canal Company returned to Yreka Sunday. Prior to his departure, in response to a request for an interview bearing upon the situation expressed himself as well pleased with the latest developed phase.

"While I am not at liberty," he said "either to disclose or discuss the terms of the arrangement between my clients and the Hot Springs company under which the street railway work on Main street, between Payne alley and Seventh street has been, for the time, suspended, yet I feel justified in saying that in my judgement the arrangement effected will in all likelihood lead up to the development of Greater Klamath Falls on lines that will be both immediate and gratifying in results."

Mr. Farragher is enthusiastic in his belief in the future of Klamath Falls and he says that "if the railways, both ends and all hands pull together, the cry will soon be not only 'From Lake to Lake' but from 'River to Springs and beyond.'"

"From Lake to Lake."  
In an interview, W. K. Brown said: "From Lake to Lake" with the addition of "From River to Springs" will be the slogan. I'm satisfied with the outcome. The arrangement is perfectly satisfactory and is bound to result in a Greater Klamath Falls. To my mind it is far better to spend the money on improvements than in a lawsuit, although I at no time apprehended such a result, for I realized the Klamath Development

Company's only desire is to move along lines that will promote greater development of our resources. That is all we desire and all we have ever asked, and the agreement just entered into accomplishes this result.

"Mr. Buell has gone to San Francisco to make final arrangements for wire, transformers and other material of this kind and we are doing our utmost to complete and carry out our plans. The work on the Buena Vista tract is progressing rapidly and you will see the growth from lake to lake more rapid than the most sanguine ever anticipated."

The Hot Springs Tract.  
"Work on our road from Seventh Street toward the Hot Springs addition will be pushed with the same vigor as was that part of the work from Payne Alley to Seventh Street," said Mr. Campbell. "I think the people of this city realize that we mean business and that our operations are being carried on in good faith. Out on the Hot Springs tract the work of grading streets and boulevards is being prosecuted energetically, and has reached a point of completion where the casual observer can easily see how beautiful it will be. We are all working for a common purpose—that of a greater city, and it is my fond hope that ere long it can truly be said that Klamath Falls is the Queen City of the Cascades."
