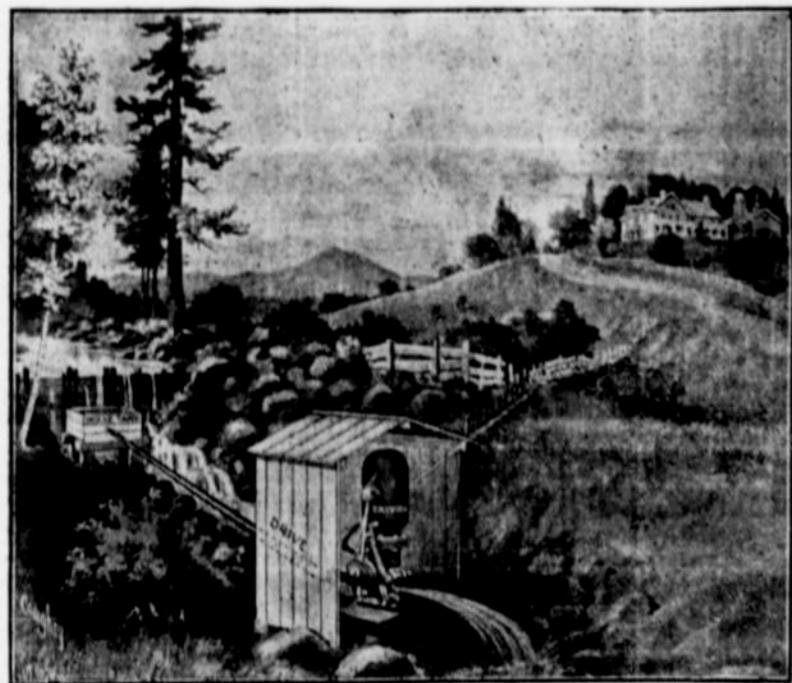
W. C. T. U. ELECTION
