A large force of men is now at work setting out trees on the Hot Springs Addition, on Pacific Terrace, Eldorado, Esplanade, and Melrose, Portland, Huron, Auburn and Erie streets.

Mrs. W. A. Walker, who has been spending the summer at Bly, returned to this city Tuesday and will remain during the winter. So great has been the change during the few months that Mrs. Walker was away that she felt as though she was in a strange city.

J. H. Rice, mine host of the Pelican Bay Lodge, has leased the Ira Hansen ranch and will take immediate possession. It is the intention of Mr. Hansen to improve his property by dredging a cut from the bay to his residence, a distance of a mile, and convert the place into a first class pleasure resort.

Klamath Falls led another laurel to her wreath of curiosities last Friday and Saturday, when the wind blew the water out of Link river. This is not literally true, but is approximately so. Beginning early Friday morning and continuing until late Saturday night the wind blew a steady gale from the south, attaining at times a velocity of thirty miles an hour. This steady breeze had the effect of backing up the Upper lake to such an extent that Link river was practically dry, and Mrs. O. B. Gates walked across the river channel without getting her shoes wet. The electric light company had but sufficient water to operate its pumping plant, so that the city was in darkness most of the time. Lake Ewauna raised 14 inches at the dock of the Klamath Falls Navigation Company, while a fall of 12 inches is recorded on the Lower lake—thus presenting the novelty of water running up hill.

The proposition, advanced by representatives of a concern manufacturing creamery supplies, for the establishment of a plant in this city on the cooperative plan, was rejected last Friday by the business men of this city. The rejection was a wise one. No one doubts but that a creamery would pay here, but the cooperative plan advanced was not an alluring one, especially in view of the fact that the price of the plant was padded several hundred dollars. This is a safe and sane system to follow in all such things and wisdom was shown in this instance when the business interests of this city refused to accept the glittering generalities advanced by the promoters.

The chief stumbling block in the shipment of goods via the California-Northern and the Klamath Lake Navigation company was removed last week when through rates were arranged and the details completed for the billing through to Klamath Falls of all shipments. All freight bills are sent direct to the American Bank and Trust company, where all charges must be paid. All claims for damages are made to the Klamath Lake Navigation company, where they will receive immediate attention. This change is of unlimited benefit to the shippers of this county, for it insures the through shipment of goods promptly and the quick adjustment of all disputes.

### CAMPBELL IS PUSHING WORK

The Hot Springs Manager Carries On Vast Improvements

D. E. Campbell, manager of the Hot Springs Improvement Company is a busy man these days. Chief among his troubles is the difficulty he meets with in securing men to carry out his plans, but is bending every energy to accomplish the greatest results possible.

On the way from Pokegama is a rock crusher, which is to be used in preparing rock for the macadamizing the streets of the Hot Springs Addition. The first of these thoroughfares to receive attention will be the Alameda, where a gang of men is now employed getting the ground ready for the macadam coating. Along with this is the new cut-off being constructed from Main street to the intersection of the old county road. This piece of work will cost over \$15,000, and will be one of the finest in the state. Another gang of men is busily engaged in making preparations for the planting of over 2000 shade trees that are to be set out at once, and which are to play such a prominent part in the beautiful landscape improvements contemplated for this addition.

The contract for the two story brick office building has been given to Contractor A. M. Taylor, and work has already commenced thereon. It will be located at the intersection of Main and Pine streets, and will have a frontage of 58 feet on Main street, with a depth of 90 feet.

Work on the street car line is being pushed on Main street and will be carried on until the entire system is completed throughout the addition. This is also true of the sewer system. The only delay in this will be the awaiting of a low enough rate on sewer pipe admit of a continuance of operations.
